Good progress has been made in meetings with Roma Thomson of Glasgow University library in looking at options

to possibly donate some of the GSG collection of rare books. The thought is that the collection would be under better protection and conditions in the main university library and would still be accessible to members (via your free Glasgow University library membership) but also make them available for use by researchers and students in the near future.

Subscriptions

You can now renew your membership subscription for the new session commencing on the 1st of October. If you already pay by direct debit you need take no action as payment will be automatically deducted from your account on that date.

If you currently pay by an alternative method, such as standing order, bank transfer or cheque would you please consider switching your payment type to direct debit. This is our preferred payment method and would significantly reduce the admin burden on our (unpaid) volunteers and helps keep costs down. Please note that the system takes the first payment shortly after you sign up for a direct debit, although the following payment will not be until 1 October 2025, so you may prefer to sign up nearer the renewal date.

To make this change please follow these steps:

1-Log into your webcollect account using the link <u>https://webcollect.org.uk/gsg</u> and press on 'renew subscription'. If you have forgotten your login details and/or password please contact the Membership Secretary to reset it <u>memsec@</u> <u>gsocg.org</u>

2- Check your details are correct and press on renew

- 3- Press checkout
- 4- Alter pay by method to direct debit in right hand side window
- 5- Press place order

If you are changing from a standing order payment please remember to cancel it with your bank so that you are not charged again on 1 October.

Its a good idea to log into webcollect and check and update if necessary your details in order that our records are correct and up to date.

Webcollect mail & junk/spam

It appears that some email servers are putting emails from the society generated via webcollect into junk/spam folders. If you're reading this then its likely that your email system is OK but its a good idea to go to your email provider settings and make sure that they don't.

Webcollect emails come from *@webcollect.org.uk, The way to ensure that emails from a particular sender aren't put into junk/spam is to designate that sender as a "safe sender". There have been a number of site meetings with GCC architects and contractors to develop a plan which is close to being finalised.



Strathclyde Geoconservation Group

The SGG is a subcommittee of the Society, it is open to all members of the Society; just turn up to a meeting, or a site visit. Its main aims are the protection and interpretation of locally important geological sites, mainly in the Greater Glasgow area. It does have a Chair, Secretary and Treasurer but that's about the only formality. The Group have been busy on two fronts, producing a series of leaflets following recent site visits and have made a start at putting information into the fledgling Geosites database. The aim of Geosites is to allow users to access geological locality information online through a map interface. Currently the database comprises GCR (sites previously assessed as Geological Conservation Review sites plus a growing number of Local Geodiversity sites.

The new leaflets are for Campsie Glen, Dumbarton Rock, Kelvin Walkway. A flyer for Calder Glen has been printed, and Linn Park and Portencross leaflets are nearly ready for printing. The latter requires a site visit before finalisation. If you're interested in coming to Portencross on the 14th August please contact <u>SGG@gsocg.org</u> for more details.




